Changes are happening in Alabama Medicaid!



New services will help patients get the health care that's right for their needs.

Starting Oct. 1, 2019, Medicaid begins a new care coordination program. The new plan will create Alabama Coordinated Health Networks (ACHNs) in 7 regions of the state. These ACHNs will coordinate primary care for people with Medicaid coverage. Your ACHN will have a phone line to call when a Medicaid member has a health problem.

To get the new services, people who have Medicaid coverage (children, pregnant women, and people getting family planning services) will need to have a primary care doctor of their choice. Their doctor will become their "medical home" – the first place to contact for ordinary health needs. And new services will be offered to improve patient health. Medicaid members who already have a primary doctor can continue under their care. Coordinating patient care through a primary doctor helps avoid expensive emergency room visits for routine health care needs.

The Alabama Medicaid Agency will be sending out information about the ACHN program so you can know who to call to discuss care coordination services. In the meantime, you can help others be aware of the coming changes.
